SECTION 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

School Hours

CPEC has adjusted its hours of daily operation. The new hours are 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday (excluding holidays and minimum days).

Access to School Computer Lab

In compliance with CPEC's social distancing practices, the school computer lab will remain closed until further notice.

Online Courses

Students will continue to take all courses online via Fuel Ed (Peak) and will be expected to complete assigned coursework from home every school day.

Weekly Meetings

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REMIND Access*

If you have not signed up for access to REMIND (a free school messaging app that will provide you with ongoing school updates), a link will be forwarded to you via text message by Wednesday, September 9th.

School Email

Given that communication from CPEC staff will also be sent via email, it is critical that students have access to school email in a timely manner. With this in mind, we encourage all students to ensure that you are able to receive school emails to your phone.

New Course Access*

Scheduling Weekly Appointment*

Reading and Math Diagnostic Assessments

STAR testing in the areas of Reading and Math will be conducted remotely during the first two weeks of school. STAR testing supports the school in identifying which Reading and Math skills students know, and which skills students are ready to work on next. The information (data) derived from the tests allow teachers to support students toward a shared goal of Reading and Math proficiency. Each test will take approximately 20 minutes and all students are expected to take the Reading and Math tests.

CPEC will contact you to schedule a testing date and time.

SECTION 3 - WEEKLY MEETING REQUIREMENTS

All students are required to meet with their teacher once a week to continue to make satisfactory academic progress (and remain in the school program). CPEC teachers have limited ability to reschedule meetings due to prior commitments with other students, so it is critical that students honor their scheduled meeting time. Failure to participate in weekly meetings will result in removal from CPEC.

Student Expectations

- Meet remotely once a week with Mr. Zeiler.
- Complete all weekly assignments as required.
- Take advantage of academic support services.
- Take responsibility for your learning and personal conduct.
